Then on Sunday, August 12, enjoy a day-long celebration of food and fibre arts with Fibrelicious: A Food and Fibre Arts Celebration at Lang Pioneer Village Museum. Indulge your senses with a smorgasbord of food and fibre arts demonstrations, exhibits and taste sensations! Visitors will have the opportunity to enjoy tasty culinary treats by local chefs including cooked local lamb prepared by chef Steve Elmhirst from Elmhirst Resort and cheese making by Cassandra Mogelin from Peachy Keene. Discover new interests through

a variety of food and fibre arts demonstrations and displays. View weaving on a table-top, two-and-four harness looms and the ultimate Jacquard loom, natural dyeing over an open fire using local plants, sheep herding and shearing, sheep-to-shawl demonstrations by the Peterborough Hand-weavers' and Spinners' Guild, vintage sewing machine and knitting machine demonstrations by the Horseless Carriage Museum, rug hooking, hand-weaving with nothing but yarn and sticks, basketry making, broom making, spinning, tatting and bobbin-lace making, drying raspberries, cooking in a dutch oven, ice cream making and more! Not only will the Steam Engine be operating this day, but it will also be cooking up a delicious pot roast with veggies. Are you an avid baker? Come see how wheat kernel is ground into flour at the Lang Grist Mill and purchase a bag to take home. Learn about the Kawartha Truth and Reconciliation Support Group quilt. Hop on board for a horse and wagon ride for a leisurely tour of the village. Stop by Aabnaabin Camp to sample some traditionally prepared wild rice. Check out the many unique items for sale in the one-of-a-kind food and fibre arts marketplace. It will be a feast for all your senses! Admission for the event is \$15 for adults, \$10 for students and seniors (60+), \$7 for youths (ages 5-14) and free for children under 5. Family admission is also available for \$40 and includes 2 adults and up to 4 youths (ages 5-14). All taxes included.
