



## 29<sup>th</sup> Annual Father's Day Smoke & Steam Show Demonstrator Day Overnight Camping Info Sheet and Rules



For the fourth time in our show history, we are offering a Saturday demonstrator gathering day.

Please review the enclosed information if you are planning to spend the night with us. We want to ensure that everybody joining us enjoys their experience!



Overnight, **self-sufficient** dry camping is permitted if you have signed in with Lang staff and completed the waiver form.

Access is available on a first-come, first-served basis after **12 noon on Saturday, June 20<sup>th</sup>**, through the Peterborough County Agricultural Heritage Building entrance at **146 Lang Rd, North Entrance**.



No fires are allowed on site; personal barbecues are permitted; further instructions will be provided upon entrance to the Village.

### General Notes

#### Location Set-Up:

**Tent Camping:** Tent camping is permitted; however, we ask that tents be removed by 9:00am on Sunday Morning, well before the opening of the show to the public.

**RV Camping:** There is designated RV Parking in the North parking lot at the Peterborough County Agricultural Heritage Building.

**Show Set-Up:** You are welcome to set up your show pieces on Saturday at your location in the Village - and leave them up overnight for Sunday's show, or if you would like, you can wait until Sunday morning. All displays should be up by 10:00am on Sunday.

**Security:** While we do have staff on-site overnight, we are not responsible for items left unattended. Items put on-site are at your own risk.



**Parking:** Please check with staff about your location to ensure your vehicle can remain in the spot you've chosen. Please note: There are parking restrictions for some areas of the historic village and staff may request that you move.



**Smoking Policy:** No smoking within the Village gates. The designated smoking areas are in the parking lots at the North and South ends of the Village.



**Pet Policy:** Friendly, leashed pets are permitted in the Village. Owners are asked to please help keep the Village tidy by picking up after your pet.

**Noise Policy:** As we are located close to private residences, we ask campers to curtail noisy activity after 11:00pm. Although we recommend that campers be aware that the Otonabee South Monaghan Townships' Noise By-Law "does not allow noise likely to disturb inhabitants at any time."

### **Amenities**

**Washrooms:** The washroom building beside the Visitors Centre and the Peterborough County Agricultural Building (PCAHB) washrooms will be open overnight for use.

**Water Access:** The Peterborough County Agricultural Heritage Building will be open for access to a drinking water fountain overnight.

**Food:** Please bring your own food for dinner. Village food sales will start Sunday morning at 8:00am.

**Fires:** Fires are NOT permitted overnight ANYWHERE on site.

**Garbage:** There is a garbage dumpster and recycling bins, at the North end of the Village. Please use these for large amounts of waste or for food waste so as not to fill up the public bins and so we don't attract raccoons.

**WIFI:** Public WIFI is available on site.
