- Roll up your sleeves and help with some laundry beside the trades barn.

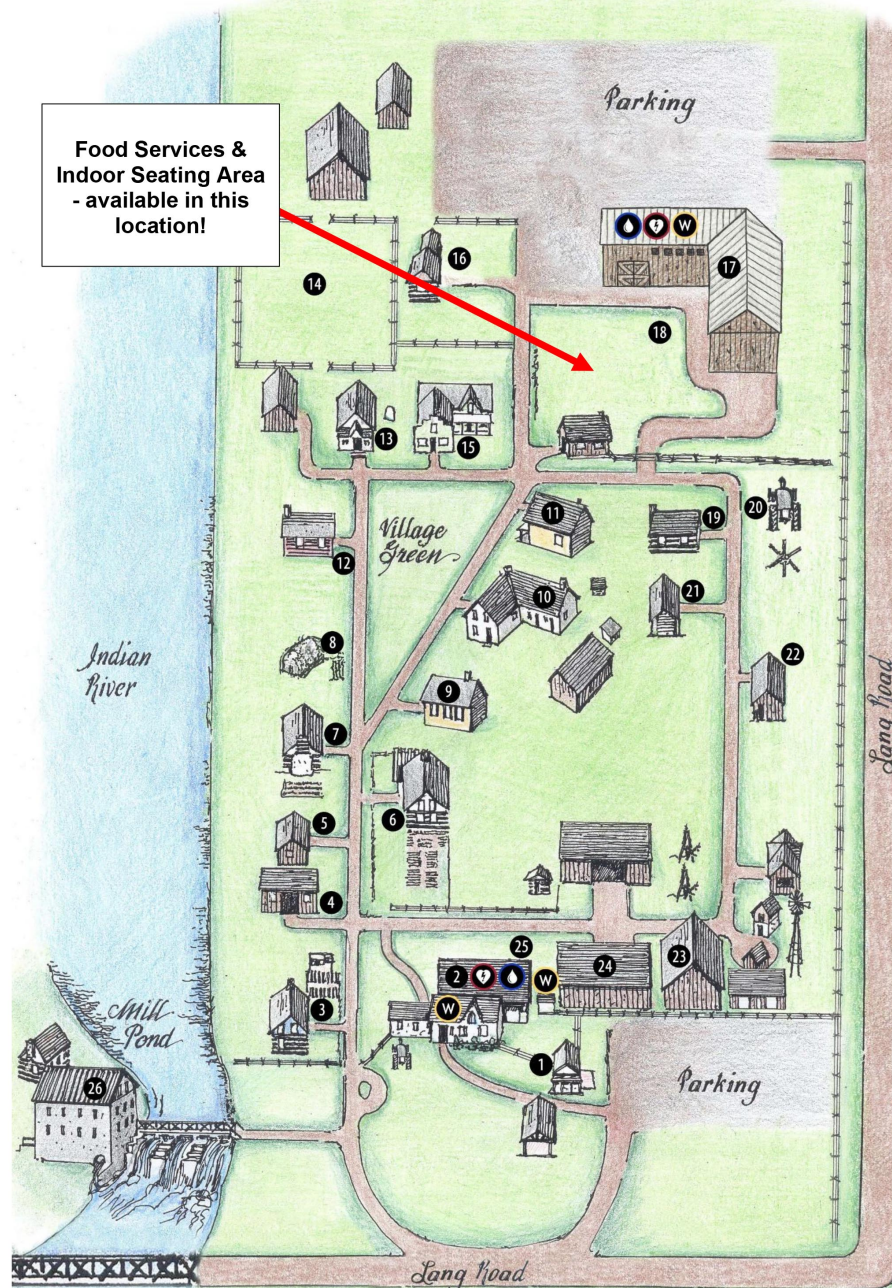
Highlights of Timed Demonstrations:

- 1:00 pm Schoolyard Races at the South Lake Schoolhouse
- 2:00 pm Pie Eating Contest on the Village Green
- 3:15 pm Tractor Parade through the Village

There is much to see and do on site today – this is just a snapshot of what you can expect!

- 1. Admissions-** Purchase tickets!
- 2. Visitor Centre & Museum Shop-** Registration for the Pie Eating Contest. Gallery: Start your trip at our exhibit Aabnaabin: Looking Back To Where We Come From. *MacKelvie Room:* All aboard! See the vintage train display.
Outside the Visitors Centre: Meet two local woodturning groups and see what they can turn out.
- 3. Milburn House-** Try a piece of rhubarb cake and learn how it was baked in the past using a woodstove. Ironing demonstration in the parlour and starting at 1:00pm, Victorian push lawn mower demonstrations out front.
- 4. Hastie Carpenter Shop-** Learn about manpower - how the spokeshaves and drawknives work, take a wood curl as a souvenir! Spring pole lathe demonstrations out front; not everything was made by machine.
- 5. Tinsmith Shop-** Watch as the Tinsmith turns a piece of tin into a useful piece of machinery.
- 6. Fitzpatrick House-** Serving samples of refreshing Raspberry Cordial. Lend a hand to the quilter and see if you can quilt a straight line.
- 7. Fife Cabin-** Learn how the settler's dyed their clothes at our natural dye demonstration.
- 8. Aabnaabin Camp-** Come and learn about the Three Sisters Garden and see Indigenous artifacts on loan from Curve Lake Cultural Centre.
- 9. Register Print Shop-** Learn how changes in power and technology effected the printing industry during the 1800s.
- 10. Keene Hotel-** A delicious selection of traditional baked goods and drinks for sale, including mini donuts, Chelsea buns and fresh lemonade. A delightful selection of heritage pop awaits at the bar.
- 11. Menie General Store-** Featuring a selection of old-fashioned candy and toys for sale. See if you can spot the antique steam toy from the Eaton's catalogue!
- 12. Douro Town Hall -** Step into this great "fake" debate. Decide for yourself what is better, gas or steam power.
- 13. Glen Alda Church-** Go in and take a seat on this day of rest. Historically people, and equipment took this day off.
- 14. Back Field –** Registration and Tractor Games, and dress up your little ones as a Junior Conductor.
- 15. S. W. Lowry Weaver Shop & Jacquard Loom Interpretive Centre-** Explore displays of the 4-shaft, 2-shaft, rigid heddle, and Jacquard looms, along with the punch card machine - and try punching your name!
- 16. Ayotte Cabin-** Craft Area - Celebrate Father's Day by creating your own rolling paper tractor, inspired by classic farm machinery.
- 17. Peterborough County Agricultural Heritage Building (PCAHB)-** Washrooms & Agricultural Wall of Fame Gallery.
- 18. Courtyard-** Ben's Kettle Corn, Lea's Creations and Bewdley Lions Club food trailer available all day! Corn box activity for kids.
- 19. South Lake School-** Take part in a lesson on steam and horsepower. Enjoy a steam toy demonstration. In the schoolyard join in on some outdoor games. If you are feeling especially competitive, races kickoff at 1:00 pm.
- 20. Sawyer-Massey Steam Engine (1921)**
- 21. Cheese Factory-** Learn how cheese was made in the 1800s. Fresh Empire cheese curd, homemade bread and pickles for sale.
- 22. Shingle Mill-** See how shingles are made! 11:00 am – 3:00 pm. Try a steam-powered pencil sharpener and take home your freshly sharpened pencil!
- 23. Agriculture Barn-** See the farm equipment of our past.
- 24. Trades Barn-** Check out the tools of the trades: Rope making demonstrations! And beside the Trades Barn, see how laundry was done and try out an old-fashioned yoke from 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm.
- 25. Fire Pit-** Steam power! See how steam can bend wood, and what wood is used for this practice.
- 26. Lang Grist Mill-** Visit the Miller and discover how wheat is ground into flour.
