There is much to see and do on site today – this is just a snapshot of what you can expect!

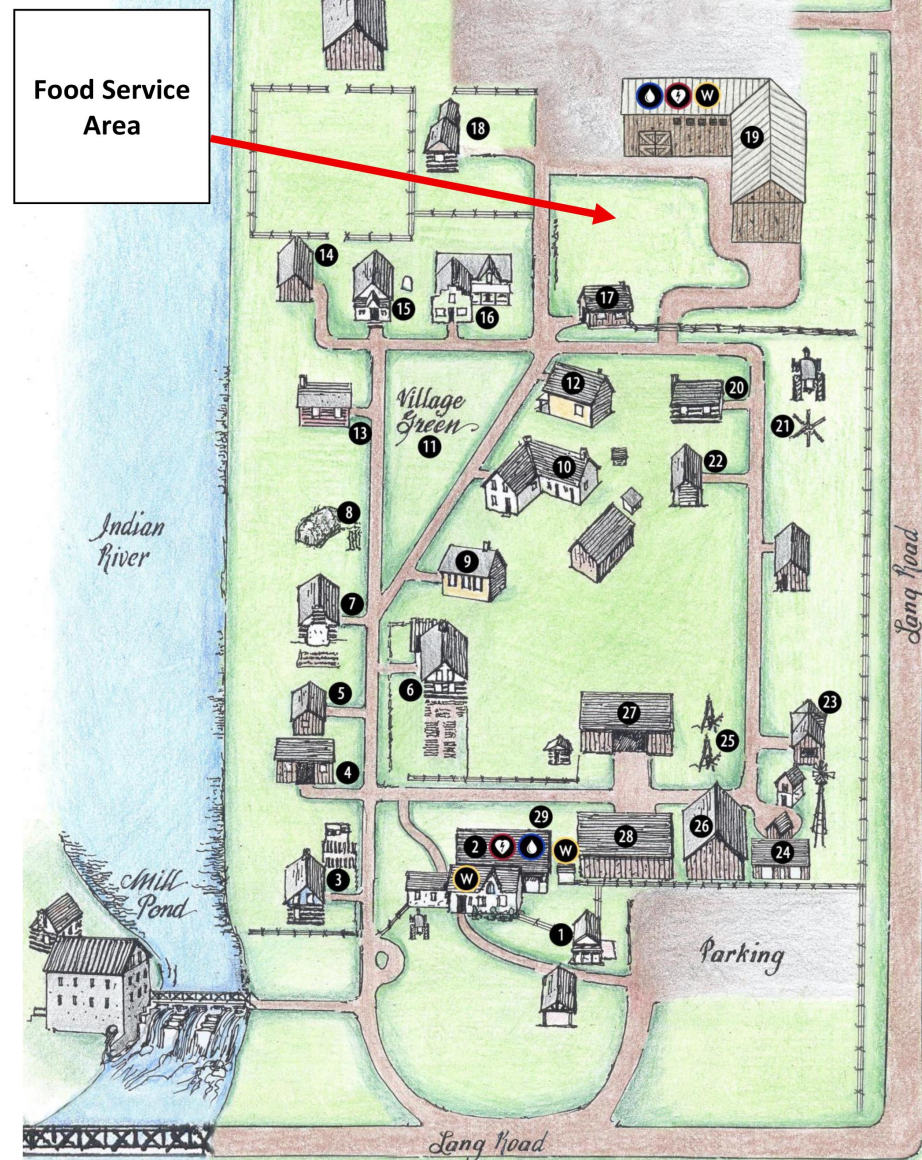
1. Admissions

2. **Visitor Centre, Museum Shop**- An eclectic collection of gift items, souvenirs, candy, and toys. Start your trip at our exhibit Aabnaabin: Looking Back To Where We Come From. *Village Entrance*: Enter a draw at the Marie Dressler Foundation Vintage Film Festival's table. Meet the woodturners from the Peterborough Artisan Centre and The Kawartha Woodturner's Guild. Meet the sheep and talk to a local yarn producer, see how yarn is made!
3. **Milburn House**- Apples make a delicious addition to baked treats! Learn about what apples are used in sweet treats and their long shelf life.
4. **Hastie Carpenter Shop**- Storage of apples for the winter was important! Hear about how barrels were made by village coopers, then go to the Apple Orchard at the Ayotte!
5. **Tinsmith Shop**- See how tinsmiths made simple tin apple corers to ease the work of apple preparation.
6. **Fitzpatrick House**- Serving apple butter samples. Learn about traditional apple remedies, some of which continue to use to this day!
7. **Fife Cabin**- See how the settlers dyed their clothes at our natural dye demonstration. Help us harvest the garden and see what early settlers would have grown for their winter meals.
8. **Aabnaabin**- Learn about the history and culture of local First Nations at Aabnaabin Camp.
9. **Register Print Shop**- Uncover the stories behind traditional apple phrases. See how harvest prints were once transferred onto paper for newspapers, magazines, and flyers.
10. **Keene Hotel**- Stop by the kitchen for a refreshing drink or a bite to eat. A delicious selection of baked goods for sale including cider and apple crisp.
11. **Village Green**- Get ready for Apple X's and O's! Stop by to support the players and enjoy the fun.
12. **Menie General Store**- Take home some candy apples from the General Store market. See if you can spot some pioneer tools for harvesting and preserving food!
13. **Douro Town Hall**- Check out an antique clock and time piece display with the Quinte Timekeepers!
14. **Church Drive Shed**- Threshing and fanning mill demonstrations, see the steam engine in action.
15. **Glen Alda Church**- Hear the sweet refrain of harvest hymns on the pump organ.
16. **S. W. Lowry Weaver Shop & Jacquard Loom Interpretive Centre**- See the Lang Weavers and find out what they are making for the village. Visit with the Northumberland Rug Hookers and see their exhibit. Do you have the dexterity for this craft? Try it for yourself!
17. **Blacksmith Shop**- Demonstrations by the village blacksmith.
18. **Ayotte Cabin**- See if you can bob for apples from the Ayotte trees!
19. **Peterborough County Agricultural Heritage Building (PCHAB)**- Washrooms, and Agricultural Wall of Fame Gallery. *Great Hall*: Peterborough Agricultural Society Homecraft Show *Courtyard*: Take a break on a picnic table and enjoy lunch from the Bewdley Lions Club or a tasty treat from Ben's Kettle Corn or Call Creations.
20. **South Lake School**- Participate in an apple lesson!
21. **Horsepower**- Try your hand at an old-fashioned apple peeler and take an apple for your troubles! Discover some of the folklore around apples, and ways they have been used superstitiously through the years
22. **Cheese Factory**- Learn how cheese was made in the 1800's. Fresh Empire cheese curd, freshly made bread and an assortment of apples for sale.
23. **Cider Barn**- See how apples are pressed into cider, making this sweet autumn treat.
24. **Mitchell Building**- (Staff Only Area)
25. **Stump/Stone Pullers**- Watch and learn how logs were hand-hewn for construction.
26. **Agricultural Barn**- See how the harvested crops were prepared for winter storage.
27. **Transportation Barn**- See the many types of 19th century vehicles, used through various seasons to transport farm goods, and people.
28. **Trades Barn**- Stop in at the tradesman's and see how cane can be turned into furniture by hand.
29. **Fire Pit**- Learn the age-old secrets of preserving eggs for the cold winter ahead.
